## Next 'History & Then Some,' Oct. 16

WALLISVILLE - Author Nancy Stanfield Webb will present a talk on her two-part biographical/historical novel *A Woman of Marked Character: The Imagined Portrait of Sarah Ridge Paschal Pix 1812-1891* at the Chambers County Museum at Wallisville, on Thurs., Oct. 16, from 6-7 p.m. The event is the second in the museum's "History and Then Some" fall lecture series, exploring Chambers County history as it relates to Texas history.

From Book One 1812-1848, Webb will briefly cover Sarah Ridge's early life and the forced relocation of the Cherokee Nation. Sarah tells her story amid the tragic resettlement of her people from Georgia to Indian Territory during the 1830s, and its ensuing, heartbreaking aftermath following the Trail of Tears.

The lecture will focus on

Book Two 1848-1891, when Sarah Ridge Paschal builds a home in the bustling port city of Galveston. After divorcing George Paschal, she moves across the Bay in 1856 to her isolated cattle ranch at Smith's Point with her three children and new husband, Sisson Pix. As a determined pioneer on the coastal prairie, she encounters a bitter land encroachment, the privations of the Civil War, cattle rustling, and heartbreaking adversities that rip her soul. Here she lives until her death in 1891, ending a life marked by hardship, through which Sarah persevered with resilience and strength.

Books will be for sale at the lecture. Admission is free but seating is limited. Please make a reservation by contacting the museum at 409-389-2252. The museum is located at 20136 Interstate 10 East.

## Heng graduates from UT-Austin

AUSTIN, TX - Kathrena Heng of Dayton graduated from The University of Texas at Austin with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology. Heng was one of more than 1,600 students who graduated in the summer and received an undergraduate, master's or doctoral degree. Many summer graduates joined the university-wide commencement ceremonies in May, marking the occasion with the broader UT Austin community.

During the 2024-2025 academic year, which ended in August, UT conferred a record 16,036 degrees. The record is attributed to the University's all-time highs for first-year student retention and four-year graduation rates.
