ney across the continental United States, the relay passed for the first time through Southeast Texas, on May 22. In Liberty, a ceremony was held on the grounds of the Geraldine D. Humphreys Cultural Center, and the city provided lunch to all the relay participants. Liberty was one of only five cities in Texas where the relay stopped for such an event.

The Sam Houston Center’s Olympic Torch Relay collection documents the event in Liberty and the relay’s passage through Southeast Texas. The collection includes photographs of the Liberty event and local relay participants, clippings from various Southeast Texas newspapers pertaining to the relay as it passed through the area, event maps, meeting minutes and notes documenting the planning and organizing of the Liberty event by a local committee, posters and other publicity materials and even preserves the torch carried in the Liberty area by torchbearer Don Kelly

of Beaumont. The city’s Liberty Bell replica was rung during the arrival and departure of the flame. From Liberty the relay passed through Ames, Raywood, Devers, Nome, China, Beaumont, Vidor and Orange before continuing into Louisiana.

Visitors may view this and other collections at the Sam Houston Center during business hours, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Tuesday through Friday, and Saturday 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. The finding aid is available online: Olympic Torch Relay collection (https://txarchives.org/tslac/finding_aids/-00052.xml).
