Youngblood’s eggs are graded and washed by this elaborate machine in the Highway 90 business in Liberty. Roy Youngblood, left, owner, has been in business six years and in the marketing of wholesale eggs for over a year. Already he markets more than 50,000 eggs a week in Liberty and Chambers counties and Baytown. The machine, with a capacity of 250,000 in a normal working week, is approved by sanitation engineers and washes the eggs in a special egg-washing detergent.
