

Vehicle pursuit follow-up: Driver identified, arrested

LIBERTY COUNTY - The Liberty County Pct. 4 Constable's Office conducted a follow-up investigation regarding a vehicle pursuit, initiated by Pct. 4 deputies on Wednesday, July 29, which led law enforcement to a wooded area on CR 442 in Dayton where the pursuit was terminated.

After reaching out to the community via the news media asking for assistance in identifying the suspects, Pct. 4 investigators received numerous

anonymous tips from citizens that identified the driver and passengers of the suspect vehicle.

Tips from citizens, along with other evidence gathered, led Pct. 4 investigators to positively identify 20-year-old Roy Lee Holcomb II of Dayton as the driver of the suspect vehicle.

On Friday, July 31, Pct. 4 investigators presented a sworn probable cause affidavit, in support of an arrest warrant for Holcomb, which was pre-

sented to Liberty County Pct. 4 Justice of the Peace, Judge Larry Wilburn.

Judge Wilburn granted issuance of an arrest warrant for Evading Arrest or Detention with a Vehicle, a third-degree felony. Charges were not pursued against the passengers due to lack of evidence to support their prosecution.

After additional information was received and evidence gathered, Pct. 4 investigators were able to establish enough probable cause to support an addi-

tional charge.

On Wednesday, August 5, Pct. 4 investigators presented a sworn probable cause affidavit, in support of an additional arrest warrant for Holcomb, which was presented to Liberty County Pct. 1 Justice of the Peace Judge Stephen Hebert.

Judge Hebert granted issuance of an arrest warrant for Unlawful Restraint: Exposure to Risk of Serious Bodily Injury, a third-degree felony.

On Friday, August 14, Holcomb, who was on felony probation for robbery in Chambers County, surprisingly reported to his probation officer in Anahuac.

The Chambers County Sheriff's Office was contacted and Holcomb was placed into custody at the Chambers County Probation Office without incident.

Holcomb is currently in custody at the Chambers County Jail on charges of Evading Arrest or Detention with a Vehicle (Felony 3), Unlawful Restraint: Exposure to Risk of Serious Bodily Injury (Felony 3).

Holcomb's probation officer is filing a petition to revoke his probation for a second-degree felony robbery charge in Chambers County.

Constable Robby Thornton would like to thank all the citizens who provided tips regarding this incident. The information received was instrumental in the identification of this suspect.

The iWatchTexas program allows Texans to report any suspicious activities or behaviors that may indicate criminal, terroristic or school safety-related threats.

The public can report behaviors via the mobile app, online at www.iwatchtx.org or by calling 1-844-643-2251. Each report is reviewed by law

enforcement analysts and all reports are confidential (providing contact information, which is optional).

The iWatchTexas app is available at no cost to iPhone users on the Apple App Store (iWatch-Texas) and for Android users on Google Play (iWatchTexas). Texans are urged to download the app now.
